Ohio	Ohio Board of Medicine (7 MDs, 1 DO, 2 Public Members, and 1 DPM)	A podiatric physician may perform surgery on the ankle joint if he or she has attained board qualified status from the American Board of Podiatric Surgery and successfully completed at least a 24 hour month residency in podiatric surgery (Ohio Admin. Code 4731-20-02 (2008)).	<p>Licensure by Examination: 1) graduate from a college of podiatric medicine; 2) one year of postgraduate training in a podiatric internship, residency, or clinical fellowship program accredited by CPME (Ohio Rev. Code § 4731.53 (2008)); 3) pass all parts of the NBPME exam (Ohio Admin. Code § 4731-12-03 (2008)). Podiatric Training Certificate: mandatory for participation in an internship or residency accredited by CPME. Certificates are renewable annually for up to 5 years. (Ohio Admin. Code § 4731-12-07 (2008)).</p>	<p>Licensure by Endorsement: The Board has discretionary authority to endorse licenses issued by another state, territory, or the District of Columbia without further examination provided other eligibility requirements are met. In order to be endorsable, the license must be based upon an acceptable written examination; must be current and in good standing; and must be full and unlimited.</p> <p>Endorsement of a podiatry license if examination was administered on or after June 12, 1990, the license must be based upon passing all subjects of the National Board of Podiatric Medical Examiners as well as the PMLexis. Licenses based upon state board examinations or other examinations administered after June 12, 1990, cannot be endorsed.</p> <p>If examination was administered before June 12, 1990, the license must be based upon a written state examination and applicant must not have failed the National Boards or the PMLexis without having subsequently passed them.
